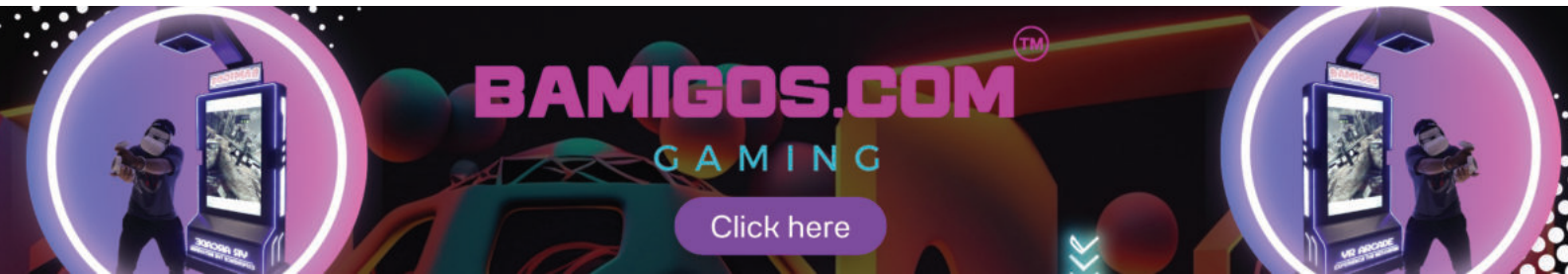
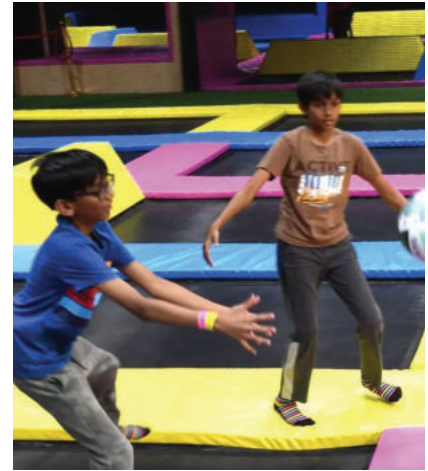

## BOUNCE opens trampoline park in Bengaluru

Theme Park operator BOUNCE has launched a Rs 20-crore indoor adventure park in Bengaluru. The trampoline park is spread over 40,000 square feet and has over 20 attractions and 100 trampolines. The company, which is looking to expand in India, plans to invest Rs 100 crore over the next two years, according to Keyur Nagori, Director, BOUNCE India. "Our newest venue will provide the perfect blend of fitness and fun for all people. We plan to take our commitment further by setting up similar facilities in other cities. Our trampoline park is designed to accommodate a maximum of 400 individuals at a time," he added. The park features the Big Bag, Slam Dunk, and Dodgeball courts, a wall climb, a zipline, and the famous BOUNCE X-Park obstacle course. It is located in the city's Orion Mall. It plans to introduce the concept of "rebound exercise" to Bengaluru, promoting the health benefits of trampolining.

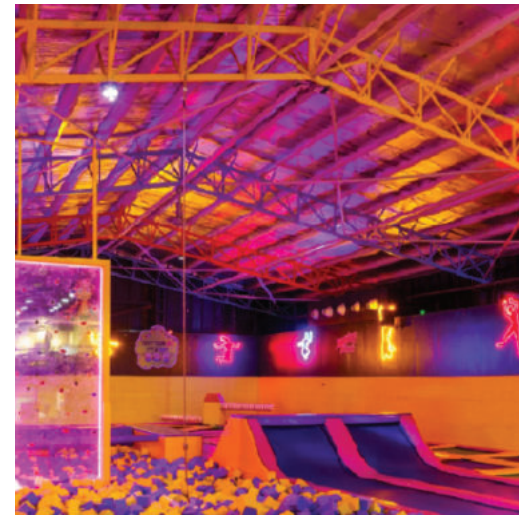

## Puy du Fou update on Oxford search for first UK theme park

Earlier this year, Puy du Fou, a historical-themed attraction, declared its interest in wanting a 300 to 400-acre site within a 40-mile radius of Oxford for its new theme park. The theme park has now said it's "continuing its search" but a site has not yet been identified in Oxfordshire. The company revealed it intends to open two new destinations in the world before 2030, with the UK remaining a preferred location. The award-winning attraction currently operates in two locations, Les Epesses in the Pays de la Loire region of western France and Toledo in central Spain. A spokeswoman said: "Puy du Fou is continuing its search for a suitable UK site in which it can provide a world-class cultural and historical experience, of the standard which has been long-established in France and more recently in Spain."

## The Largest Film Studios to be Built in Europe

The Tenerife Cabildo are set to approve plans today, Thursday, for the construction of one of the largest television and film studios in Europe in Adeje, with 19 state-of-the-art studios, aquatic stages, large virtual spaces, and the latest post-production facilities, which will make the island a target for the movie industry for years to come. The KISS Media Group has been working on the development of one of the largest audio-visual hubs in the world for several years, which will be called Imagine Green Studios (IGS). This project will mean that Tenerife will compete with London, Prague, Rome, and Berlin, the current cities that attract the majority of Hollywood blockbusters for filming, due to their size and capacity.

## Portland Museum of Art awarded \$300K USDA grant

The Portland Museum of Art was awarded a \$300,000 federal grant that's expected to help the organization advance its use of mass timber in its \$100 million, 60,000-square-foot expansion project. The money was awarded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture through its Wood Innovations Funding Opportunity Program. The program seeks to advance the use of wood as a sustainable building material while supporting rural communities and their economies. The museum's project is a campus expansion and unification that it's calling "The PMA Blueprint." It includes a new building at 142 Free St. made from mass timber, terracotta and glass. A curved roofline is designed to frame the sun as it rises and sets, in honor of Maine's Wabanaki communities and the land they call Wabanakik, or Dawnland.
