## No RT-PCR for vaccinated, asymptomatic travellers

Domestic air passengers do not need to wear PPE kits and States need to give wider publicity on whether incoming travellers need negative RT-PCR or RAT results, said a fresh set of guidelines issued by the Health Ministry.

The new guidelines for domestic travellers travelling by flight, train or inter-State bus, issued by the Health Ministry, supersedes its earlier directive on May 24 last year. It said the guidelines are issued to have a uniform protocol for domestic travel across the country. The Ministry also urged the States and Union Territories to exempt asymptomatic persons – who have received both doses of vaccine 15 days before the travel – from taking the Covid-19 test.



At the same time, travellers need to follow all Covid-appropriate measures, including the wearing of masks, hand hygiene and maintaining physical distance of six feet.

They should make sure that they do not have any symptoms related to Covid-19 while travelling.

All air, train and bus operators have been asked to make sure that passengers observe Covid-appropriate behaviour, have thermal scanners at entry and exit points, and ensure that masks and face shield are available to those who do not possess them.

# Darjeeling's Toy train to resume services after more than a year



Darjeeling's famous 'Toy train' has started chugging again from August 25, after a gap of more than one year due to Covid-19 pandemic.

Formally known as the Darjeeling Himalayan Railway (DHR), the Toy train will run again on tracks between New Jalpaiguri and Darjeeling in West Bengal from today. According to the Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR), each Toy train will have 17 seats in the first class and 29 seats in the general class for passengers. The resumption of the hill station railway services is expected to benefit the tourism and hospitality sectors, the NFR added. The Toy train was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1999.

Lion sanctuary GG Conservation in Harrismith, South Africa, is placing visitors inside Plexiglas cages stationed at the center of the lions' lair, granting animal enthusiasts a palm-to-paw encounter with their menagerie of 77 rescued big cats.

"We have been offering this experience for almost two years now," director of the nonprofit wildlife park Suzanne Scott, 53, told Caters. "The safety of both our guests and big cats is top priority."

For 2000 to 3000 South African rand, which converts to about \$134 to \$197 in US currency, tourists are locked inside GG's "professional photography cage" for 45 minutes from 6:30 a.m. until 7:15 a.m. each day — depending on weather and staff availability.
