## 'Uttarakhand's decade': PM Modi inaugurates projects worth Rs 18,000 crore

Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated and laid the foundation stones of multiple development projects worth around Rs 18,000 crore in poll-bound Uttarakhand on Saturday, 4th December 2021. He also inspected the models of the projects, including that of the Delhi-Dehradun Economic Corridor which will be built at a cost of around Rs 8,300 crore.

He added, "Today, India is moving forward with the intention of investing more than Rs 100 lakh crore in modern infrastructure." The other projects included the 120 mw Vyasi hydro-electricity project, a 38-km long stretch between Devprayag and Shrikot on NH-58 and a widened 33 km stretch between Brahmapuri and Kaudiyala on Rishikesh-Badrinath national highway.

He also announced that the services of three new medical colleges would soon be available in the state.

## Madhya Pradesh: Safe Tourism for Women initiative launched



Madhya Pradesh tourism destinations will soon be far safer for women travellers, especially those travelling alone, with the Madhya Pradesh Tourism Board (MPTB) launching a special project 'safe tourism destinations for women in MP' with the support of the ministry of women and child development (MWCD).

The project will be implemented in a phased manner at 50 destinations in the state in the next three years at a cost of Rs 27.98 crores. Sixty per cent of the project cost will be borne by the Union government and 40 per cent by the state government.

The project was recently approved by the MWCD under its 'Nirbhaya Scheme'. It was cleared by the MP state cabinet that met under Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, with the mention that the state government was committed to the safety of women.

New Delhi: Union Minister Nitin Gadkari said that he envisions to "create value from waste" and is planning to use green hydrogen to run buses, trucks, and cars in different cities.

Addressing the sixth National Summit on Financial Inclusion, Mr Gadkari said, "I have a plan to run buses, trucks and cars on green hydrogen that would be produced using sewage water and solid waste in cities.

"I am trying to create value from waste," he added. The Union Minister, in an attempt to "make people believe" that vehicles can ply on hydrogen extracted from wastewater, said, "I've bought a pilot project car that would run on green hydrogen produced in an oil research institute in Faridabad. I would take a ride of the city to make people believe..."
