Addressing the last day of the two-day India International Cruise Conference here, Reddy also urged the industry stakeholders to prepare a road map for the development of the cruise tourism industry and asked them to create an action plan on cruise tourism in a mission mode.

The government is taking a slew of initiatives to promote river cruise tourism, which include river front development, increasing the number of cruise ships to 1,000, infrastructure development for water parks, among others, he said at the event hosted by the ports, shipping and waterways ministry in collaboration with industry body FICCI.

Himachal Pradesh govt signs MoU for development of seven ropeway projects

Himachal Pradesh government has signed MoU for the development of seven ropeway projects in Kangra, Kullu, Chamba, Sirmour and Bilaspur districts of the state. The MoU was signed between Ropeways and Rapid Transport System Development Corporation (RTDC) HP Limited and National Highways Logistic Management Limited (NHLML) for the development of ropeways as innovative transport solution in Himachal Pradesh.

The MoU was signed in the presence of Union Road transport and highways minister Nitin Gadkari and chief minister Jai Ram Thakur in New Delhi yesterday. The Chief Minister said that initially, possibilities will be explored to prepare a feasibility report of seven ropeway projects in Kangra, Kullu, Chamba, Sirmour and Bilaspur districts at an estimated cost of 2,264 crore rupees.

Hong Kong Palace Museum expected to open to public by summer 2022

Hong Kong's HK\$3.5 billion version of the Palace Museum in Beijing is nearing completion and expected to open to the public by summer 2022. Betty Fung Ching Suk-yee, CEO of the West Kowloon Cultural District Authority, said the new museum is set to open this summer as a "gift" to residents to celebrate the 25th anniversary of Hong Kong's handover from Britain to China. "The exact opening date will depend on our exhibits and the progress of the interior construction," she said (via South China Morning Post). Fung said the Hong Kong Palace Museum, which broke ground in 2018, is "hoping to offer this gift to Hongkongers on the 25th anniversary of the city's handover".

The museum will house nine exhibition galleries, as well as a 400-seat auditorium, a learning and innovation centre, and F&B outlets.

Japan prepares to reopen to tourists for first time since 2020

Japan will start conducting "test tourism" in the form of limited package tours in May ahead of a full reopening to tourism. Though tourism was a major pillar of Japan's economy, tourists have not been permitted to enter since it adopted strict border controls in 2020 at the start of the coronavirus pandemic.

Regulations have been loosened slightly to allow students and some business travellers to enter. But individual tourists remain barred despite calls from industry leaders hoping to restart tourism to take advantage of the yen, which has fallen to 20-year lows. Japan's Tourism Agency said it would start allowing small group tours to enter from later this month as "test cases" to gain information for a broader resumption of tourism at an unspecified future date.
